WRITE-IN MAYORAL CANDIDATE JERROLL SANDERS, DETROIT'S ONLY HOPE FOR A BING DEFEAT

DETROIT, MICHIGAN—Detroit's future literally rests in the balance with Mayor Dave Bing set to regionalize Detroit's assets, break the unions that have become synonymous with Detroit's middle class and discontinue bus and other services deemed critical to Detroit's largely unemployed and financially strapped residents. It seems the candidate who offers the greatest promise of change has been largely ignored in the Mayor's race. Write-in Mayoral Candidate Jerroll Sanders has won the hearts of Detroiters in less than a year on the campaign trail and she has done it with very few dollars. Residents find her thoughtful, genuine and tough—a real threat to the male contenders for mayor who seem to espouse tired political mantra's and empty plans. What a race this would be if Sanders was afforded even half the coverage conferred upon her male counterparts in a City that desperately needs new ideas, proven experience and motherly care and concern.

According to Sanders, the media blackout is yet another sign of corruption in Detroit. She claims to have won in the primary and it seems many Detroit residents agree, some having written letters to the Department of Justice asking for intervention before the November 3, 2009, election commences. "There has been one election transgression after another and each transgression alters our election culture, making malfeasance more and more acceptable," Sanders says. "If the federal government can intervene to ensure elections are fair and equitable in far-away lands, then certainly the 'feds' can intervene in Detroit where corruption has been rampant and present in every nook and cranny of government," she adds.

Sanders says she has received some interesting propositions from her opponents' camps. One messenger stated Mayor Bing's camp planned to make her an offer. Sanders says she told the messenger an offer from the Bing Camp would be a waste of time. Sanders reports receiving a similar overture from persons associated with her other mayoral opponent, Tom Barrow, who eked past Sanders with less than 1000 votes in the August Primary. According to Sanders, Barrow's associate suggested she and Barrow combine forces, with Sanders taking the campaign lead because of her high favorability ratings. Sanders says she enjoyed a private laugh when Barrow recently appeared before the Council of Baptist Pastors and declared his numbers were three times higher than current Mayor Bing's. She says Barrow is delusional, adding that his 11 felony convictions that include bank fraud and financial mis-dealings at a local hospital have made it impossible for him to climb to the numbers needed to defeat Bing. **Sanders says she is Detroit's only hope for a Bing defeat**, adding that she will continue to spend her days walking and talking to the people of Detroit, listening to their concerns and caring about their lives. She is predicting an upset on November 3rd
